

Secondly, we must realize that someone loved us and died for us. Jesus Christ died on a cross to pay the debt for our sins, and to pave the way for us to have an opportunity to go to heaven. Romans 5:8 says, "But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." When Jesus died on the cross, His blood paid the penalty for all of mankind's, sins. "In who we have redemption through his blood, even the forgiveness of sins:" (Colossians 1:14).

We must come to the realization that we cannot do anything to earn or help earn our way into heaven. Jesus completely paid for it when He died on the cross. Just before He died He said, "...It is finished:" (John 19:30). Having paid the ransom for us to escape the bondage and penalty of sin, He now wants to give us a home in heaven. "... the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." (Romans 6:23)

When Jesus saves us, it is forever. When Jesus died, he didn't stay dead. On the third day, after His burial, He arose from the grave with all power (authority) in heaven and earth in his hands (Matthew 28:18). He now lives eternally seated in heaven. When we, by faith, accept Jesus' aift of His eternal life, we too are assured of eternal life. However, like all gifts, this one does us no good unless we receive it for ourselves. No one... not parents, grandparents, spouse, siblings, pastor, priest, best friend, or anyone else, can receive it for us. We have to personally receive it for ourselves. "But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name:" (John 1:12). This belief is not some watered down version of a mental assent of Jesus' existence. For Satan believes that! This belief is one that entails, surrender, hope, trust, confidence, and dependence, on Christ as the object of our faith and belief.

The Bible says we are "saved through faith" without needing to add anything else (i.e., our dead works). "For by grace ye are saved through faith; and that not of yourselves; it is a gift of God: Not of works, lest any man should boast." (Ephesians 2:8,9). The only faith that saves is complete faith in Jesus Christ. "...Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved..." (Acts 16:31). Anything we try to add to faith is "works."


Beloved, are you saved? Or, are you:

- Still trying to get to heaven based on your own merit and performance?
- Of the mind set that you'll "get saved" once you quit all your bad habits and "get yourself together?"
- Waiting until you can quit sinning before you allow Christ into your life?

If are not saved, then let me encourage you no, let me urge you - to cease from your works and accept the gift of eternal life through Jesus Christ. Christ has already paid for your every sin...past, present, and future - EXCEPT FOR ONE! If you don't spend eternity in heaven, it will be because of only one sin – the sin of unbelief. "For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved. He that believeth on him is not condemned: but he that believeth not is condemned already, because he hath not believed on the name of the only begotten Son of God." (John 3:17,18). If I may be blunt... A loving God does not choose to eternally separate people from Himself, in a place commonly referred to as Hell... people make that choice when they choose to reject the free gift of salvation offered through Jesus Christ.

(Hebrews 12:2)
